All Saints' Church will be joining us this week.

There is a very famous hymn written by the American Quaker John Greenleaf Whittier, entitled *Dear Lord and Father of Mankind*. The hymn as we know it is the final 6 verses of a poem that extends to 18 verses (or stanzas) entitled *The Brewing of Soma*. It is the first line of the third hymn verse that I was struck by recently:

O Sabbath rest by Galilee!
O calm of hills above,
Where Jesus knelt to share with Thee
The silence of eternity
Interpreted by love!

What *is* a Sabbath I wondered? Well the dictionary tells me it's 'a day of religious observance and abstinence from work, kept by Jews from Friday evening to Saturday evening, and by most Christians on Sunday.'

I can remember what Sunday's were like in my childhood – all the shops and cinemas were closed, and even the pubs in the part of Wales I grew up in! My sister and I were not allowed to play outside, and woe betide anyone who hung out their washing! Not particularly positive cultural incentives for non-churchgoers to maintain a respectful attitude towards those who wished to 'keep Sunday special', and not particularly helpful for those whose work made it essential for them to work on a Sunday either!

So, what is a Sabbath for me I wondered! It is certainly *not* a Sunday as that is one of my busiest days of the week – very far removed from being a day of rest! No, for me Monday is my Rest Day – my Sabbath – a day to relax, do something I enjoy, spend quality time with family and friends and try to maintain that mystical 'work-life balance' that is apparently, according to psychologists, the goal for everyone.

In his very readable book *Sabbath as Resistance: saying no to the culture of now* the eminent American theologian Walter Bruggeman commends everyone to establish a Sabbath during their weekly life in order to re-charge our batteries. For his inspiration he goes back to the creation story (Genesis 2:3) and the story of the exodus from slavery in Egypt (Exodus 16:22-30) when God sent manna (bread) from heaven to feed the people but instructed them *not* to gather-up the food on the Sabbath. Bruggeman's assertion is that if God needed to take a rest day each week then we humans most certainly do too!

When then is your Sabbath, your day of rest, your day of re-engagement? If we don't deliberately set aside time for relaxation and reflection – if we 'burn the candle at both ends' – our lives are surely the poorer for it.


