## From the vicar, Richard Hare

At the time of writing I'm just about to launch into a week of interviewing and decision-making. Bishop Alison has asked us to consider training a Curate from next summer, so Richard Townend and his family are spending a weekend here looking at both Barmston and Emmanuel – we have to decide jointly if this is going to the right place for them all. Then it's straight into two days of Headship interviews at Hilderthorpe School, where I'm Chair of Governors. We're looking at six capable candidates – but who will be just right for the post? The next day I'm involved in selecting our first formerly homeless residents for the Hope Housing Bridlington house, as part of the new project set up by Barmston church and the other Anglican churches in the area. Will they get on with each other? Will they be able to get their lives back on track with the support we're able to offer? It's all very daunting stuff, and the possibilities of making the wrong choices and having to live with the consequences for quite a long time are making me nervous...

At times like this I'm grateful for a verse in the Bible which goes like this: "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you." (James 1: 5) So I'm praying for heaps of wisdom and insight, not only for me but for others involved in the various interviews with me.

All of us have tricky decisions to make at times, with work or family or home or investments or a host of other things. So if like me you find yourself a bit worried about getting it wrong, can I commend that verse from the Bible to you? God gives generously to all without finding fault, it says – so why not ask him for the wisdom you need?
